

Synopsis



Thank you for your interest in screening How To Recall!

This guide and toolkit is intended to help you host an impactful and successful screening. Here we have included a few tips to help bring this event to life.



Promotion: Make sure you promote your event! Social media, email, and phone calls are great ways to spread the word. Resources, sample language, and images can be found here.

Timing: Give yourself at least two weeks to schedule, plan, promote, and execute your event.

Organizing your Event: We highly recommend having a post-screening conversation or panel. Partner with other organizations for participants, reach across the aisle for different points of view, and develop a list of questions that will address the local and personal issues your audience cares about. Event Preparation: Make sure you test your technology at least a day in advance of your screening so you have plenty of time to troubleshoot. If you are doing a panel conversation, do a test run with your participants and ensure they are all comfortable with the run of show.

Christopher is a 2021 and 2024 Olympian, and 2024 World Cup
 Champion mountain biker from Durango, Colorado. He's also a poet and
 rapper, particularly interested in the ways poetry can explore universal
 emotions and find common ground. He's very excited about a project
 that is at the intersection of many of his passions.

Christopher grew up in Durango Colorado on two wheels, racing bikes across multiple disciplines from age 5 onwards. He studied Sociology and Entrepreneurship at Cal Poly in San Luis Obispo, while training for the cross-country MTB Olympics in Tokyo. After competing in the Olympics in 2021, Christopher went on to win the first short track World Championships, and became the first American male World Cup winner since 1994.

Beyond racing, Christopher is a spoken word poet and musician, often writing about the universal within the personal. He hopes to blend his poetic voice with his climate advocacy through POW, tapping into the experiences we have outdoors, and how they can point us towards stewardship and connection.
